

Research 5 different roles in a film production and summarise the responsibilities and qualities needed to carry out each role.

1 Director
They hold the creative vision throughout the whole process. They stay with the film from pre-production through to the final edit. It's the job of the director to imagine the script in a visual form. They work with the majority of teams such as heads of departments, editing team and the producer(s). They direct members of the crew including lighting, wardrobe and make-up supervisors.

2 Producer
Producers are at the financial, ~~practical~~ practical and creative heart of the film. They are usually the first people to get involved in a production. They continue as the driving force of the production. They are the overall decision makers and hire writers to secure rights to scripts.

1st Assistant Director (1st AD)

3 The 1st assistant director is the person making sure everyone is doing the correct thing on set. Cinematographer

Screenwriter
